2. Click on the words “Reference Databases”
3. Follow the links and instructions to connect to AccessScience using your library card number

Search tips and examples:

The easiest way to search is to enter key words or a phrase for a quick search. For a broader overview of a topic in its context, click on “Browse/Explore.”

Search Results:

- Look for the little icons to the left of each item’s title in the search result list. This icon tells you the category of the article—whether the item is a definition, encyclopedia article, news article, research update, or biography.
- You can click on a category link at the top of the search result list to limit your results to only that category of article. A category can be empty.
- In the search result list, items with the same title and in the same category may be parts of the same article, just broken down into sections.

Articles:

- If a link puts you into the middle of an article, you can tell by looking to the top where you’ll see something like this:

◀◀ PREVIOUS page 2/3 NEXT ▶▶

The number in bold is the page you are viewing. You can jump quickly to different sections of an article using the pull-down list at the top.

- To view the entire article and format it for printing, click the “printable version” icon. From the printable version page, you can use your browser’s commands to print or save the article.
- You can also e-mail a link to the article. The e-mail will contain a link to the article in PDF format, which requires the free Adobe Reader software. The link will expire in two days.
