Gale Virtual Reference Library brings ten reference books into a single searchable resource.

Books included in Gale Virtual Reference Library:

Animal Sciences—examines animal ecology, development and behavior, and the connection between animals and humans

Beacham's Guide to the Endangered Species of North America—extensive data on the habitats and ecosystems of more than 1,200 species identified as endangered or threatened by the U.S

Cities of the World—cultural, geographic, and political conditions in 193 countries and their cities

Encyclopedia of American Religions—contains general essays that historically trace the major religious families and traditions; directory listings include contact and descriptive information.

Encyclopedia of Small Business—detailed articles to help small business owners, including financing, business plan creation, market analysis, sales strategy, tax planning, and human resource issues.

Encyclopedia of World Biography—approximately 7,000 biographies on notables from every part of the world and from all time periods.

Gale Encyclopedia of Everyday Law—historical background of legal issues, profiles of various U.S. laws, details of state variations, and references to print and Web resources and relevant organizations.

Gale Encyclopedia of Multicultural America—essays on specific culture groups in the U.S., emphasizing religions, holidays, customs, and languages; historical background and settlement patterns.

Geo-Data: The World Geographical Encyclopedia—physical geography of every nation and dependency: physical features, climate, and vegetation. A World Rankings appendix includes dozens of tables ranking major features of the Earth, such as largest rivers, tallest mountains, and deepest oceans. Includes a glossary of geographical and geological terms.

Worldmark Encyclopedia of the Nations—information on 200 countries and dependencies of the world, from banking and securities to climate, from government data to demographic statistics. Also includes biographical essays on national leaders.

Gale Virtual Reference Library tips:

1. Enter any word or combination of words in the Search Box. If you enter more than one search term, the search will find articles that contain all of the terms you entered. Capitalization does not matter.
2. Use double quotation marks to search an exact phrase—“natural selection”—but do not use this for personal names, since there may or may not be a middle name. Use the *w* operator instead: **Richard w2 Nixon** means “find *Richard* within two words of *Nixon* in that order.”
3. Use the * symbol to stand in for various endings of a word: **produc*** will find *produce, product, production, etc.*
4. To search one of the books in the collection, click on “View publications” beside a subject from the Basic Search page, click a book title, then click “Search this eBook.”
5. To browse one of the books, select a book using the steps above, and click “eTable of Contents.”
