This is a collection of databases available to all Tennessee citizens, funded by the federal Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) administered by the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

Databases in the Tennessee Electronic Library:

InfoTrac OneFile A large index of general-interest magazine, scholarly journal and newspaper articles on all subjects.

General Reference Center Gold General articles and reference sources on all subjects.

Expanded Academic ASAP Scholarly and technical articles.

National Newspaper Index Indexes five major U.S. newspapers.

General Business File ASAP All business and management topics; includes directory listings for over 150,000 companies.

Computer Database Computer and related technology topics.

Health and Wellness Resource Center Health, fitness, diseases, drugs and treatments.

Professional Collection Full-text articles to support K12 educators.

Infotrac Religion & Philosophy Custom Database Religion, philosophy, and related areas of archaeology and anthropology.

Military & Intelligence Database Military and related social, political, historical, business and technology topics.

InfoTrac Student Edition Designed for high school students.

InfoTrac Junior Edition Designed for middle school students.

Kids InfoBits Designed for elementary school students.

Contemporary Literary Criticism A collection of critical essays on contemporary authors. Each entry contains a bibliographical/critical introduction, listing of principal works, and bibliography.

TEL tips:

- To search for variations of a word, use an asterisk (*) in the place of unknown letters, various spellings or word endings. For more advanced search features, explore the “Help” screens.
- Several of the databases offer an **e-mail** link so you can send an article to yourself. Sometimes the database will send just the text (no graphics).
- Most databases provide a **print** link for reformatting an article for printing. Use this link instead of printing from the first display of an article to save paper.
